IWF Health Testing Updates

The Irish Wolfhound Club of Canada invited the IWF to test at their specialty in Belleville Ontario on the 19th of September. Thanks to Sid Wood for handling scheduling and payments. The club provided a fine location in the host hotel within sight of the ring. Bill Tyrrell and Mariellen handled the morning testing while I ran off to do LGRA. Donna Tomson drew blood for us and helped with the testing while Sid helped with paperwork. The club had a good sign up and a few walk ins for a total of 24 dogs.

The Irish Wolfhound Association of Delaware Valley hosted us again at their specialty. Bill and Mariellen again handled the testing while I tried to keep paperwork flowing. Joanne Buehner Brown drew blood. We tested a total of 31 dogs and added several to the DNA database.

The Northern California Irish Wolfhound Club also offered to collect cardiac data this year when they did heart testing. They arranged to have Dr Justin G. Williams, DVM DACVIM a local cardiologist come to do the testing and provide the data to the IWF for the research. Robin Burchett and Lynne Rosebrock handled arrangements. The IWF sent a package of information on the procedures we use, including the forms and envelopes and paid for a portion of the test cost for each dog. The NCIWC tested 24 dogs with echo and EKG and 4 more EKG only and the data has been received and is being categorized for statistics.

Statistics for IWCC and IWADV are to the right. Some of the diagnostic statistics for NCIWC are still being compiled.

New Fundraising Challenge for the "Texas 72" Rescue

Donations coming in for this unprecedented rescue situation have been impressive; to date the IWF has received over \$45,000.00, thank you to all that have donated! With that said, most of that funding has been distributed for the first phase of this rescue, including transport, boarding, and medical cost.

Going forward we will still need monetary support to help get these hounds placed in their forever homes. Many to date are still recovering from upper respiratory issues, some are being treated for heart worms, and all are improving from their overall poor condition. Many have been placed, but many more are still in foster homes while recovering and awaiting spay/neuter. All of this costs money and the bottom line is we need more donations. At this time we estimate needing an additional amount equal to what we have already received in donations. This is staggering but a true realization. We are receiving reimbursement requests from many of the IW rescue groups' and individuals nationwide on a weekly basis, this could continue for months.

A bright spot in all of this is the generosity of our community;

Regarding the Houston, TX rescue situation, all 33 hounds that were boarded at the local Prestonwood Kennel have now been removed. Ten of those 33 hounds were transported up the east coast to Rice, VA. Also, eleven hounds were transported directly from the SPCA to NM/CO. All of the other hounds are now being cared for by the South Central Irish Wolfhound Club (SCIWC) members and their foster homes.

For a more detailed follow-up on the TX rescues, I am pleased to introduce you to the SCIWC Rescue Chair – Ann Sury. Ann and her rescue committee have done an outstanding job handling this horrendous situation. While I'm always very proud of the job our IWCA/IWF rescue volunteers do (sort of like a Mother Hen proud!!). I'm exceptionally "proud" to be the National Rescue Chair of this group.

Texas Rescue Report - Ann Sury

For the Foundation Newsletter, November 15, 2014

Having been in rescue for over 25 years you think you've seen it all. And then something like the event in September of this year happens to alter your perspective.

I received several emails the first week of September alerting me that there were hounds in Santa Fe, TX needing homes. That was followed by several conversations with Jean Minnier about the course of action to take on a situation that was still unclear.

The news story broke on September 12th that the Houston SPCA had seized over 100 animals from an owner in Santa Fe, TX; over 70 were Irish Wolfhounds. Stunned by the sheer number of hounds, our SCIWC Rescue Committee became the agent to the Houston SPCA for IWCA. The court hearing was attended by SCIWC members, Dick Morrison, President, and Robin Smith of the Rescue Committee. The Houston SPCA was awarded custody of the hounds. There was a waiting period of 10 days after the hearing to assure that the owner did not contest the judgement. We organized our action plan to address the needs of the hounds at the SPCA with a very small, but efficient, recruited volunteer network lead by Robin Smith. Team Houston members provided ongoing and invaluable support to the hounds. It is hard to describe in words my first view of the hounds. Many were emaciated, sick, covered with ticks and very scared. Fur was matted and some had dreadlocks that reached the ground due to neglect. A number of hounds were heartworm positive and unable to be touched. The emotional toll ranged from shyness to complete distrust and fear. I worked closely with my SPCA point person, Tara Yurkshat, who enabled daily interaction of volunteers with the hounds. Over the next three weeks, Team Houston spent almost every day visiting and working with the dogs. An online survey, IW HELP, was set up on SCIWC website and facebook page to manage the data of over 600 offers of support in

the way of transport, foster, food, funding, administrative help and supplies. Messages were received from all over the United States. Adoption applications were submitted and received from many states including Alaska and Hawaii.

Team Dallas began the routine weekly trips to Houston, sometimes twice in a weekend. The hounds' new temporary quarters were in a warehouse building on the SPCA grounds separate from the main population. Mel Mercer, JoHannah Lawrie, Dick Morrison & I assessed and facilitated to prepare the hounds for the next step – leaving the SPCA. Dr. Mercer assessed medical needs for the hounds, worked with the SPCA veterinary staff and provided supplemental drugs and supplies where she could. I visited the infirmary where the sickest hounds were being treated. There was heartbreak when we lost some. We assessed, placed collars on hounds for identification, tagged kennels with the healthiest hounds for first transport and identified others needing more urgent medical attention. The SPCA was a great partner during this phase of transition. Due to their general condition, many were susceptible to illness, which we found, could change daily. On day 10, after the court hearing, the first group of hounds left the SPCA via vans heading north. Most hounds were carried to the crates. They would not walk on a leash and were too afraid to move. The first transport of 11 hounds arrived at Brenda Fairbanks kennels on October 5th. They were unloaded and placed in her care until picked up the following day for transport to RMIWC in New Mexico and Colorado.

The next group of hounds that had either medical issues or were able to travel, were moved the following week to the Dallas area. To enable better management of the hounds needs, the remaining hounds were moved to Prestonwood Kennels, a private boarding kennel facility in Houston. There, volunteers had greater open access

and ability to work with staff to address more medical issues, clean, bath and further socialize them. Many of the hounds were shaved due to infection or infestation. They were housed in their own building away from the general kennel's population with indoor/outdoor heated/air conditioned areas. A yard was available for focused one-on-one training for the few that were able and willing. The hounds received a reduced rate during their stay at the Kennel. We thank Gwynette Peebles, the owner of Prestonwood, for her support and willingness to work with us.

Soundness and health of the hounds was an ongoing concern for the next transport group. After assessment by two vets and secured health certificates, the next transport left for the East Coast on October 20th under the guidance of JoHannah Lawrie and Team Houston. By the next week, other dogs were moving out to foster homes. On November 3rd, the last hounds were moved out of Prestonwood. It was a happy moment for everyone knowing that one more phase had been completed for these hounds.

Much progress has been made but there is still much work to be done before all the Texas 72 are placed in their forever homes. I am still in the process of selecting fosters for these special needs hounds and assigning Mentors to support the fosters in their effort to show these hounds what it means to be cared for and loved. This is an ongoing process requiring additional medical treatment, supplies and patience. I owe much to the members of my Rescue Committee for their time, fortitude and commitment to helping these hounds on this journey. At this writing of eight short weeks I have traveled over 4,200 miles and responded to well over 1000 emails and phone calls. I have also made a number of new IW friends I would have never met if it were not for this unfortunate event in the first place. And then there are the many wonderful stories to share of new Irish Wolfhound Rescue fosters and owners. I consider it an honor and a privilege to make happy endings possible. Success is not easy without a true team effort requiring coordination, cooperation and communication.

I applaud all who have volunteered their time to help, from the folks in Texas who were on the front line, to all the Rescue folks throughout this country that have had a hand in coordinating homing hounds etc. The list is endless, well done! I also must mention the great relationship between the Foundation and the Irish Wolfhound Club of America, we came together and communicated to the Wolfhound community quickly and decisively which facilitated the fundraising.
